

The major merit of the quartet corresponds to the newly titled Grand Master Luis Ernesto Quesada Pérez, who begins the year with an ELO coefficient of 2 507 units, enough to settle in the tenth absolute seat of the country.

The possibilities of progress for the so-called Florence Bear are evident in this beginning of the year, when, starting next 12th, he competes, in the Palacio del Chess Guillermo García, of Villa Clara, in the semifinal of the Creole championship, tournament at which will attend, as a favorite, to obtain one of the four tickets to the final.

Something distant, but with an excellent step, appears the scholar Kebert Solares Orozco, Cuban leader among the boys of 13 to 15 years, due to his rating of 2 178 points, which ratifies it among the novels of greater perspectives in the country.

In that same section another place was included, Alian Alberto Borroto Fajardo, who, after a magnificent year, promoted his ELO to the figure of 2,015, which included him in the ninth seat.

For the girls, Elizabeth Heredero Gascón stands out, who, in the last women's zone tournament, held in Santa Clara, added 82 stripes to her ELO, which reached the height of 2,782, enough for the ninth place among the girls of 13 15 years old.

The data, contributed by the professor and statistician from Villaclareño Osmani Pedraza Ledón, denotes progress among the local novels; However, the situation in the province is not favorable with respect to the technical force in charge of guiding the talented players, whose fundamental alternative lies in self-preparation, experience applied by Quesada Pérez, called to be included promptly in the national preselection.
